Mr. Austin introduced Robert Brown, Assistant Residency Administrator, Donald Harvey, Maintenance Manager, and Clayton Thomas, Contract Administrator.

The purpose of the hearing was to review the Six-Year Plan and to take requests for new additions and road improvements. The Department of Transportation works with the Board of Supervisors to prioritize these projects as well as those listed on the Unpaved Road Priority List. As funding was available, projects on the Unpaved Road Priority List were placed on the Six-Year Plan.

The following is a summary of the requests made for New Additions and Improvements. The Road Viewers would review these requests in the spring. If a subdivision plat was recorded prior to 1949, the road could be brought into the system at no cost to the homeowners. After 1949, the costs were shared 50/50 from rural addition funds and homeowner contributions.

// Several residents of Holiday Forest Subdivision were present to inquire the status of Holiday Lane. Holiday Lane was included on the County's revenue sharing application. There were still right of way issues with a couple of property owners on Holiday Lane but the residents were very near collecting its 50% share. Mr. Austin advised that because of the new revenue sharing guidelines, it was not likely this project would receive any funding. As far as the availability of rural addition funds, there were three 100% funded projects ahead of this one, namely McDaniel Lane, Hill Top Drive and the remainder of Smokey Hollow Road. The Board would have to decide on the priority of these projects. County Administrator recommended the Holiday Lane residents to contact area Legislatures to encourage them to support additional transportation funding.
