The vision statement of the Campbell County Emergency Medical Services Advisory Committee is:

**“The Volunteer Rescue Squads of Campbell County, while functioning as separate and wholly independent organizations, will work in a climate of cooperation with each other and with the Campbell County Department of Public Safety to provide emergency medical services to all citizens and visitors of the areas we serve. This service will be of consistent high quality and be provided in a timely manner. We will create and maintain a culture that fosters good morale that results in member retention. We will demonstrate our ability to lead and manage the emergency medical services system in Campbell County by acting in a fiscally responsible, collaborative, and professional manner”.**

**Goals and Objectives to support the vision:**

1. Create and Support an “EMS Recruitment and Retention Committee”. (FY2007)
2. Increase training opportunities to the volunteers of Campbell County and foster inter-squad training. (FY2007)
3. Identify and resolve problems with the current radio communications system, and work to establish a plan to make improvements to such. (FY2007)
4. Evaluate the need for priority dispatching and implement such, if needed. (FY2008)
5. Establishment of a central purchasing point for durable medical equipment and supplies for the Rescue Squads through the Department of Public Safety. (FY2008)
6. Work to create a formal awards and recognition program for the Department of Public Safety, the Rescue Squads, and the Fire Departments. (FY2008).

7. Have a comprehensive EMS needs assessment completed by the appropriate personnel. (FY2009)
8. Provide for some type of ALS education funding for the members of the Volunteer Rescue Squads as a retention tool. (FY2009)
9. Establish an additional CIP funding program (revenue recovery based) to provide for capital expenses related to the improvement of the delivery of pre-hospital services. (FY2009)
10. Work to standardize medical equipment found on the ambulances throughout Campbell County. This will include standardizing 12 lead EKG monitors throughout the County and ensuring an effective, common method of transmitting the EKG data is in place, county wide. (FY2010)
