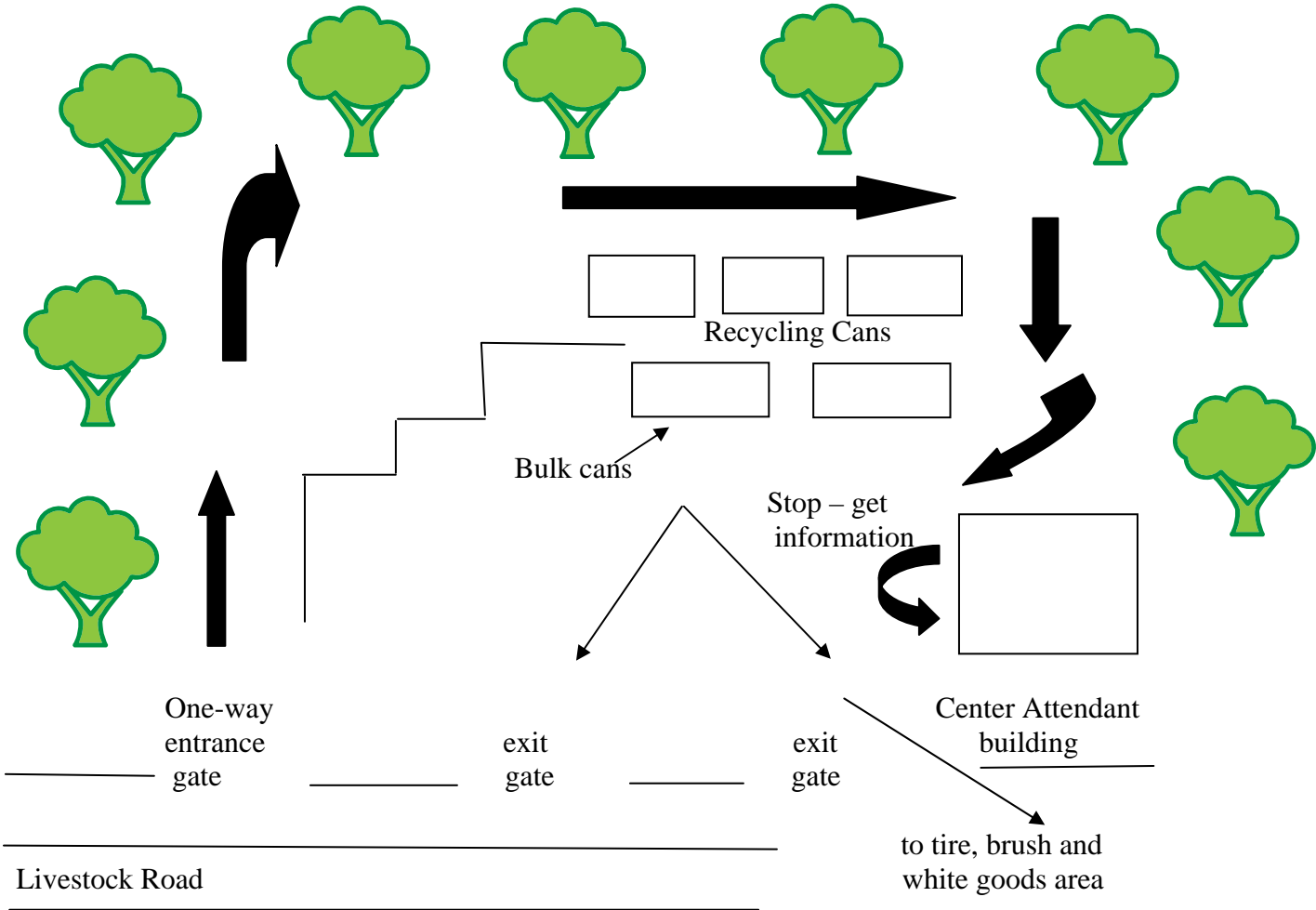

A Guide to Your Disposal Needs





Campbell County Residential Customers

Effective July 1, 2008, the Campbell County Landfill will become part of the newly created Region 2000 Services Authority.

For your convenience, the Landfill Center has been re-designed to accommodate your needs. Any county resident may use the Landfill Center located on Livestock Road (across from Foster Fuels on Route 29).

The traffic pattern has been changed at this Center. Please follow the new traffic pattern and check with the site attendant to be directed where to dispose of your refuse. You will be directed to an adjacent area for tires, brush and white goods.

This center will operate from 6:30 a.m. – 9:00 p.m. seven (7) days a week. In addition to household trash, this drop off center will accept clean brush, tires, appliances, small bulky items, oil, batteries and other recyclables. You will be directed where to go by the Landfill Center Attendant.

Items permitted at the center include:

Bagged Household Waste

Construction & Demolition Waste from residential homeowner improvement projects only. No shingles are allowed at any time.

Latex Paint – dried with sawdust or kitty litter

Items not permitted at the center:

Regulated Hazardous Material
Pesticide containers not cleaned, crushed or opened

Drums not emptied, cleaned and opened

Gas tanks and cylinders

PCB or Dioxin containing solid waste

Fluorescent bulbs

Shingles

Dead animals

Items accepted for recycling:

Waste Oil

Batteries

Tires – per County Code Chapter 12, Section 12-16.1 “County residents may dispose of eight (8) tires, in loads of up to four (4) tires at a time, at the Livestock Road Transfer Site only, at no charge within the same calendar year.

White goods (appliances)

Mixed paper

Newspaper

Aluminum

Aluminum cans

Bi-metal cans

Corrugated cardboard

Brush & leaves, not bagged



If you have questions about recycling before July 1 call 821-7125; after July 1 call 455-6085.

No businesses (large or small) are permitted to use the centers. Residential debris hauled in any vehicle including commercial or employer-owned vehicles will be limited to the equivalent of a pickup truck bed of approximately 60 cubic feet per day. Any larger loads must be taken to the Region 2000 landfill.

Shingles and dead animals will not be allowed at any of the drop off centers, but will need to be taken to the regional landfill on Concord Turnpike at the standard tipping fee.

We hope this transition will not interfere with the service you have received from us in the past.

If you have questions about the Landfill Center before July 1 call 821-7125; after July 1 call 332-9528.

If a resident finds it more convenient to use the landfill located on Concord Turnpike, they can go directly there. Any residential customer will be allowed to deposit up to 500 lbs. per month at no charge. Over 500 lbs. will be billed at the current tipping rate.
