

Voter Registration in Virginia

To Register to Vote, voters must:

- ◆ Be at least 18 years of age
- ◆ Be a legal U.S. Citizen with a permanent legal residence in Virginia
- ◆ Not have lost the right to vote due to a felony conviction or being adjudicated mentally incompetent.

To Register/update your registration:

Have you moved or changed your name?

- ◆ Voter registration records are not tied to any other record
- ◆ Changes to your name or address through the Post Office or other County office DOES NOT change your voter registration
- ◆ Books close 21 days prior to any election and remain closed through Election Day

Moved after books closed for an election:

- ◆ Contact Voter Registration Office to see if you may be eligible to return to your old precinct to vote
- ◆ Update address or name to be eligible for future elections
- ◆ If you move out of the Commonwealth, you will not be allowed to vote except in Federal Elections for President and Vice-President only

Information required to register:

- ◆ Voter furnishes information under oath, with penalty of a felony for false information
- ◆ Full legal name
- ◆ Current resident address
- ◆ Date of birth
- ◆ Social Security number

Political Party affiliation:

- ◆ Virginia DOES NOT register voters by party

VOTING ON ELECTION DAY

- ◆ Polls are open 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- ◆ Voters must vote in precinct based on residence address
- ◆ There is NO voting in the Registrar's Office on Election Day
- ◆ Voters must present valid ID such as a Virginia issued driver's licensed, passport, military ID, employer ID, etc. (a full list can be found at <https://virginia.elections.gov>)
- ◆ Curbside voting is available for voters 65 years old and older or anyone with a temporary or permanent disability.

Party Primaries:

- ◆ Used by Democratic and Republican parties to nominate candidates
- ◆ Held third Tuesday in June for offices on November General ballot, if called by the party
- ◆ Voters must designate which primary they wish to participate in if both parties hold simultaneous primaries, pursuant to Virginia Code §24.2-530
- ◆ Each party primary is a separate election with a separate ballot even if held on same day

NO EXCUSE ABSENTEE / EARLY VOTING

- ◆ Begins 45 days prior to every election
- ◆ Same ballot is used as on Election Day
- ◆ Complete a "Permanent Absentee Application" to receive ballots for all future elections
- ◆ Applications can be completed online at <https://elections.virginia.gov> or by requesting a paper application
- ◆ In-person early voting takes place in the Registrar's Office located at 41 Courthouse Lane, Rustburg during regular office hours
- ◆ Office is open two Saturdays immediately preceding all elections for early voting
- ◆ Deadline for in-person early voting is 5:00 p.m. on Saturday immediately preceding Election Day
- ◆ Marked Vote By Mail ballots can be hand delivered to the office by the voter or placed in the drop box located outside the office
- ◆ Marked Vote By Mail ballots must be received no later than 7:00 p.m. on Election Day or post-marked by Election Day and received no later than 12:00 p.m. on Friday immediately following Election Day

WHAT TO EXPECT AT THE POLLS

When you arrive, election officers will be there to help you:

1. CHECK IN

⇒ Say or write your name and address.
Show and acceptable ID.

2. RECEIVE AND CHECK BALLOT

⇒ Make sure it includes all contests for your district.

3. GO TO VOTING AREA AND VOTE

⇒ On your ballot, fill in the oval next to your choice

⇒ When you are done, scan your ballot.

If there is any issue, an election officer will direct you to vote a provisional ballot.



VOTER RIGHTS

- * Ask for a new ballot if you want to change your vote before you cast it.
- * Vote a provisional ballot if your name does not appear on the voter list or you forgot to bring an acceptable ID and refuse to sign the ID Confirmation Statement
- * Vote if you are in line at 7 p.m. on Election Day when the polls close.

SECURITY/ELECTION INTEGRITY

- ◆ Use optical scanners manufactured by Hart Intercivic as certified/specified by Commonwealth of Virginia
- ◆ Each state has different specifications for equipment
- ◆ Equipment from same manufacturer does not necessarily have same components or functionality as in other states
- ◆ Scanners (tabulators) are NEVER connected to internet (they do not have modems)
- ◆ No totals are transmitted electronically (not capable without modems)
- ◆ Every piece of voting equipment used is tested before each election as required by Code of Virginia
- ◆ Equipment is locked and sealed after testing prior to Election Day
- ◆ No totals or results are pulled from scanners until polls are closed on Election Day; even for Early Voting
- ◆ Precinct totals are reported to the Registrar's Office after the polls close on Election Day
- ◆ Totals are manually entered into the state database by office staff
- ◆ Election officers are trained prior to every election on current laws and election guidelines
- ◆ Elections Office is non-partisan
